Four-Question Gospel Conversation

This method directs a conversation to an opportunity to share the Gospel. This is a conversational form of evangelism. We really want to be genuine in this form of evangelism, as we see Jesus and other members of the early church do in Scripture to share the truth of the Gospel. There are two questions, the first is to get the conversation started, and the last one is a question to insert a gospel conversation.

- Questions about their city: Where are you from?
 - > What are your favorite/least favorite things about the city?
 - > Where do most people go to church there?
- Questions about their family: What about your family?
 - > What does your family do for fun?
 - > What traditions do they have?
 - > Do they go to church?
- Questions about them personally: What about you?
 - > What are your hobbies/interests?
 - > What is the one thing you can't live without?
 - > Do you agree with what your family believes about church?
- Can I tell you what I believe? (share the Gospel, possibly use 3 Word Story)
- The whole point of this method is to ask questions about people, their families, towns, and beliefs through questions and conversations. Be interested in who they are. Get to know people, be prayerful for opportunities, and God will open the door for you to share the Gospel. This doesn't have to be forced, but with prayer and the intention to get to know people, I think you will be surprised about the natural opportunities you experience to share the Gospel.
